✠ **September 18, 20, and 21 are ember days: Wednesday and Saturday are days of fast and PARTIAL abstinence; Friday is a day of fast and FULL abstinence.**

✠ On the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: “*And with regard to ourselves, how deservedly do we keep the Feast of the Assumption with all solemnity. What reasons for rejoicing, what motives for exultation have we on this most beautiful day! The presence of Mary illumines the entire world so that even the holy city above has now a more dazzling splendour from the light of this virginal Lamp. With good reason, thanksgiving and the voice of praise, resound today throughout the courts of Heaven... let us not complain, for here we do not have a lasting city but we seek one that is to come, the same which the blessed Mary entered today.*” - St. Bernard of Clairvaux

✠ On the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (August 22), let us renew our baptismal vows and consecrate ourselves to Our Lady:

*I, . . . , a faithless sinner, renew and ratify today in thy Heart, O Immaculate Mother, the vows of my Baptism; I renounce forever Satan, his pomps and works; and I give myself entirely to Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Wisdom, to carry my cross after Him all the days of my life, and to be more faithful to Him than I have ever been before.*

*Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, in the presence of all the heavenly court, I choose thee this day for my Mother and Mistress. I deliver and consecrate to thee, and to thy Immaculate Heart, as thy child and slave of love, my body and soul, my goods, both interior and exterior, and even the value of all my good actions, past, present and future; leaving to thee the entire and full right of disposing of me, and all that belongs to me, without exception, according to thy good pleasure, for the greater glory of God, in time and in eternity. Amen.*

✠ Excerpt from the Glories of Mary by St. Alphonsus de Liguori on the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady: “*Behold we are about to consider a new kind of martyrdom; we have to consider a Mother condemned to see her innocent Son die as a malefactor on an infamous gibbet. This Mother is Mary, who indeed, with too great reason, is called by the Church the Queen of Martyrs; yes, for Mary in the death of Jesus Christ suffered a more cruel martyrdom than all other martyrs; for*

*I. Her martyrdom was never equaled.*

*II. Her martyrdom was without relief.*
